## ENTERING THE SEASON OF LENT



Beginning with Ash Wednesday (February 14<sup>th</sup> this year) the Church enters into the season of Lent. Lent lasts for forty days, excluding Sundays, and ends with Holy Saturday, the day before Easter Sunday.

This Lenten season, we will be focusing on the life and faith of one of Jesus' most famous disciples – Peter. In many ways

we can see ourselves in Peter. Peter is both steadfast and unsteady, a dear friend and a betrayer, a follower and a wanderer. He wants to follow Jesus but says things like, "I'm not prepared. I'm not capable. I'm not deserving. I'm not faithful enough. I'm not smart enough."

During Lent we will watch the story of Jesus unfold through the eyes of Peter. Peter – a very normal human being trying to figure it all out, just like us. Faith is a journey. Peter kept going. He kept searching and yearning and loving, even after missteps or mistakes. Peter's story reminds us that God loves imperfect people and in fact, time and again, that's precisely who God claims and calls.

Ash Wednesday Worship Service, February 14, at 7:00pm – We will enter the season of Lent as we come together to worship. We will celebrate Holy Communion and we will receive ashes as a way to begin this season with humility and repentance.

The forty days of Lent offer us the opportunity to deepen the inner work we each need to do in order to go out into the world to seek and serve all others with compassion, love, and hope.

**LOOKING FORWARD** (watch for more details in the coming months)

**Holy Week** does not arrive until the last week of March but I want you to prepare and look forward to the culmination of our Lenten season.

Maundy Thursday, March 28, begin gathering at 5:30pm and share a potluck meal together in the Covenant Center. This is a wonderful opportunity to fellowship together and share conversations and a wide variety of food. The Lord's Supper will be shared this evening around our tables.

Good Friday Worship Service, March 29, at 7:00pm.

**Easter Sunday, March 31,** we celebrate the Resurrection of the Lord!


*Easter Sunrise Service at 7:00am* in the Chapel with fellowship to follow in the lounge.

## SESSION JANUARY HIGHLIGHTS

Rev. Dr. Pat Hammond announced to the Session that her last Sunday would be April 28, 2024. The Session was saddened by this news but is profoundly grateful for the service Pat has provided to the congregation. The Session and Personnel Team, in consultation with Presbytery, will evaluate the possibility of obtaining a Bridge Pastor while the Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) works through the process of finding the next permanent Pastor.

Session thanks the congregation members who agreed to serve on the PNC: Peri Erdmann, Gary Hoekman, Denise Kolba, Dave Olson, and Krista Wright. Session also recognized Peri for her assistance with Communion.

The balance of the meeting concerned financial matters. Elder John Ulmer reported that Sarah Callahan is making good progress as Business Manager and has most tasks well in hand. In particular, Sarah has all the information needed to produce expense reports for teams. She continues to refine several processes and procedures.

The November 2023 year-to-date statements indicate that we

have collected \$376,800 in income compared to \$375,700 of expenses. This is \$8,000 ahead of budget compared to \$20,000 behind budget at the same time in 2022. The Session is aware that the giving pattern over the last few years has seen decreased giving during the spring months, so it is too soon to draw significant conclusions from this data.

As of early January, 102 pledges have been received totaling \$441,000. This is essentially consistent with the same time last year, both in terms of the number of pledges received and the amount per pledge.

Session voted to authorize Elder John Ulmer to explore moving some cash to take advantage of higher interest rates.

Ministry teams should be aware that Session plans to approve the fiscal year 2024-2025 budget in June 2024, so budget requests will be coming soon.

## **MEMBER SPOTLIGHT**

Jeff and Judy Little are long time members of First Presbyterian Church. You often see Judy's visible presence singing in the choir and Jeff's invisible presence working on audio and screens for Sunday morning worship.

Judy grew up in the small ranching community of Arthur in the Sandhills of Nebraska. Growing up, Judy was the church organist. She was even excused from school to play for funerals, weddings and other community events. She moved to Sioux Falls and graduated from Sioux Falls College (University of Sioux Falls).

Jeff grew up in Sioux Falls in the McKennan Park area and was educated in Sioux Falls Public Schools. After high school, he took vocational radio and television production and worked at KSOO TV before being hired by the SF school district to run cable to every school, producing local programs and scheduling them on the school's television channel.

Judy was hired to write curriculum and teach first through third grade music classes for the Sioux Falls School District via cable television. Jeff was the producer and they worked closely together for five years before the district made the financial investment in in-person teachers for all grades. Rather than part ways, they decided to get married! That 45-year union produced two sons, Steve and Andrew, one daughter-in-law, Katherine, and one adored first grade grandson, Oliver.

In addition to teaching and writing elementary music curriculum (39 years) for the SF school district, Judy taught piano and helped start and direct two community choirs. She was also a scout leader. Jeff was one of the founding members of Habitat for Humanity of Greater Sioux Falls. Jeff formed his own video production company which was active until this year, but he still contracts with the school district to work in video production. Judy keeps busy babysitting, gardening and doing all kinds of arts and crafts and plays bass clarinet for the Horizons Community band.



Jeff has served in various capacities at FPC. He served as deacon, on pastoral nominating committees and taught Sunday School in addition to audio visual requests. In addition to singing in choir, Judy occasionally directs, plays bells and is on the Adult Education Ministry Team.

And what do they like about FPC?

Jeff appreciates the Presbyterian form of church governance. As an avid historian, he recognizes the strong links with our country's founding. He is passionate about the church's emphasis on loving all people ahead of politics, power or money. Judy likes how FPC isn't shy about examining difficult theological questions. Judy says, "The church has become much more hands-on, encouraging sacrificial involvement in community and world needs."

### FEBRUARY CHILDREN'S OFFERING

The Children's Offering for February will be designated toward purchasing and assembling Birthday in a Bag Adventures for the children who celebrate their birthdays with their parents during a weekly visit at Family Visitation Center.

Most kids wake up in the morning, come home from school, or go to bed at night with their mom and/or dad there to give them a hug...or two or three. However, for kids whose lives have been disrupted and turned upside down because they are caught in the middle of adult issues like divorce, separation, or a menu of other traumatic conflicts...that's <u>not</u> the case. They often find themselves living, at least temporarily, apart from one or both parents.

Some of those kids go to Family Visitation Center every week to spend one precious hour with their absent parent(s). Since that one hour is the only hour of the week they are able to spend time together, they *need* to celebrate their birthday at FVC if their birthday is that week. Although every situation is unique, there are times when parent(s) either forget it's their



child's birthday – or they simply can't afford a gift and party supplies. In cases where a protection order is in place, the child <u>can</u> celebrate his or her birthday with the parent with whom they are living, but the non-custodial parent can't legally attend.

When Family Visitation Center has bags available, they are able to provide the visiting parent with a Birthday Party in a Bag upon a parent(s)' arrival for their visit with their child(ren). The bag might contain themed plates, utensils, napkins, table covers or decorations, party favors, balloons, banners, and a gift. The contents of the bags vary, but the excitement they elicit from the birthday honoree is immense!

Sunshine Foods donates a cupcake for the birthday boy or girl and each individual present in the room for the party. This practice allows every child to celebrate the most important day in his or her life with both of the people they love.
