THE GOLDEN THREADS OF FPC MISSION AND EDUCATION



As we look back through 140 years of history that make up the fabric of FPC, we notice golden threads that are woven through the entirety of our life together. These are the threads of Mission and Education – threads that woven together help us define

our identity.

Recently we looked at ourselves and you noted: We are the kind of church that . . . prays, serves, cares, is welcoming, and worships through music. You also said: We are the kind of church that is strongly active in mission (serving/caring for/reaching out to others) beyond the walls of our church building. You also said: We are the kind of church that values spiritual education for every age.

During the month of January, during worship and adult education, we will look more deeply at God's mission and how we respond to God's call to come alongside what God is already up to in the world.

January 7 – This Sunday we share the sacrament of Holy Communion and we celebrate Epiphany and the Baptism of the Lord. Epiphany recognizes the time when the Magi completed their long trek across many countries, finally arriving to greet Jesus. Then, at the Baptism of Jesus, the first step of Jesus' public ministry is revealed to us as Jesus is baptized by the Holy Spirit. Jesus leaves the water of baptism and begins his earthly ministry.

Today, in celebration of Epiphany, each of us will choose a Star Word. This is a word that you will be asked to reflect on for the coming year. Ponder what significance this word might have in your life and how God might be speaking to you through that simple message.

January 14 – Read Luke 16:19-31, the parable of *The Rich Man and Lazarus*.

January 21 – Join Pastor Pat as we welcome two missionaries who will be preaching and sharing about their work in a closed country in Asia. They are involved in a project ministering to marginalized/trafficked women from the countryside who previously worked in the red-light district but who have been rescued. They will also lead an adult education class immediately following worship.

January 28 – Join Pastor Pat in welcoming Pastor Chris Matson to the pulpit. Pastor Chris, ELCA, is the pastor at Church on the Street, a church that serves the unhoused in Sioux Falls. FPC is an Ecumenical Partner with Church on the Street. Pastor Chris will also lead an adult education class immediately following worship.

It is only right that FPC begin the year wrapped in acts of mission.

May 2024 be filled with lots of stories of FPC loving God and loving others. As it should be.

SESSION DECEMBER HIGHLIGHTS

Four months into the fiscal year (July - October), FPC has received approximately \$309,000 in income and had approximately \$285,000 of expenses. This is 39% of the budgeted income and 32% of the budgeted expenses during the first 33% of the fiscal year. While this suggests that the income and expenses are roughly aligned, some caution is warranted because neither income nor expenses are evenly distributed throughout the year.

To date, the pledge drive has collected 82 pledges totaling \$345,000. At the end of the stewardship campaign last year, there were 135 total pledges totaling about \$590,000. The

average amount per pledge is essentially unchanged from last year. The Session reminds everyone that it is important to have an accurate understanding of the resources the Church can call on as we begin to search for new leadership. If you haven't done so already, please take time to consider your pledge for next year and return it to the church office.

The Session continues to identify members willing to serve on the Pastor Nominating Committee. We thank everyone who has considered undertaking this important task.

DEACONS HIGHLIGHTS

Sharing Christmas/Angel Tree project in 2023

We served 32 families with a total of 136 individuals. The congregation purchased gifts for all 136 angels! We also purchased and packed food boxes for 17 small families and 15 larger families.

Deacons helped with a half-day work day on November 18th, addressing postcards, Christmas cards, angel wish lists, and labels for gifts as well as putting up and decorating the angel trees and placing the pew envelopes. Deacons also gathered, labeled and sorted gifts by family on December 6th and carried all the family bags to the storeroom. Several Deacons on December 8th helped sort, box and distributed non-perishables by family, assisted by Hy-Vee staff who brought in all the food and boxes and helped with sorting. On December 9th the Deacons sorted and distributed perishable food boxes and returned the gift bags to the Covenant Center. From there, 10 Deacons and 6 other families from the congregation had their cars loaded by the other Deacons and made multiple trips all across Sioux Falls and Harrisburg to deliver the gifts and food. A total of 6 families picked up at the church. We were able to contact families and distribute all of our Angels this year.

A big THANK YOU to all those who helped with this project in many ways including our facilities staff and, especially, Chandra Isackson, who keeps everything running smoothly along!
