# MAY SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

Heidi Dykstra, Ruth Parry, and Kate Hruby were recognized for their work with the youth this year. Linda Hubbard was recognized for her hours working on the book sale. Session also noted the continued activities of the Deacons as described in their report.

Elders John Ulmer and Gary Hoekman reported on the Finance Team meeting. The focus of that meeting was a careful review of the March general fund statements. March 31 is 9 months into the fiscal year, and at the end of the month, the year-to-date (YTD) giving was \$35,194 below budget. If this trend continues, more analysis of giving patterns will be needed. On the other hand, building use income is \$18,960 above budget. As of March 31, YTD income was \$4,367 below expenditures for the fiscal year.

The Finance Team noted that since 2019 FPC has operated on continuation budgets. An objective of the Session and the Finance Team over the next few months is to produce an updated budget to present at the Annual Meeting in October. Teams will be contacted for their input in the budgeting process.

Session noted that since Jacob Forstein is FPC's Director of Facilities, it would make sense to correspondingly refer to the Buildings and Grounds Team as the Facilities Team. The language will be adopted going forward. Jacob Forstein then reported on the recent Facilities Team meeting. There was a general discussion about how to plan for expenses related to a large, aging building. Recent non-budgeted spending has been high, and most of these expenses have been for site maintenance.

The Facilities Team also recommended several new and updated forms related to building use. Session approved

MAY DEACON HIGHLIGHTS

First Presbyterian Church was recognized at The Banquet for its support for the Khor Wakow Project which built and operates schools in South Sudan. The project is led by David Jal, a Sioux Falls resident who immigrated from South Sudan. The Neighborhood Care Team helped contribute funds for snacks and meals for students, books, medicines, mosquito netting, tents, and other supplies.

The Feeding South Dakota Mobile Food Pantry has shifted its operating time slightly- now 8:45- 10:15 AM, still on the second Saturday of the month.

The Eat Well Mobile Market project's grant application has been approved by the City Council. The coalition is now

updated Facilities Use Guidelines and a New Schedule of Fees. Session recommended that the proposed Building Lease and Building Assumption of Risk Forms be reviewed by an attorney before adoption. Session also authorized spending requests for annual yard cleanup and replenishment of first aid and defibrillator supplies.

Session was updated on the preliminary work done by John Boerigter to start the process of finding a vendor for website development. Rev. Dr. Pat Hammond is in the process of forming a group to organize web content prior to soliciting bids for the new web page development and integration of FPC's online presence. The donor behind this activity has been briefed on the potential costs.

Session also discussed a Perkins fund proposal. Session decided that making block grants to outside groups from the Perkins fund would not be the sort of foundational activity that would lead to sustainable activity involving FPC. Session would instead like to see Perkins-funded activity have a direct connection to FPC, and the request for proposals will be updated accordingly. The next deadline for Perkins proposals is September 15.

The nominating committee reported some success in filling Elder and Deacon spots for the upcoming election, but there is still work to be done. Session discussed training and information for new Elders. Finally, Rev. Dr. Hammond reported on pulpit coverage in June when she will be gone on vacation and study leave. Session wished Pat a restful, restorative, and enlightening time away.
